Aldborough, October 19, 1862

Dear Son daughter and grand children. we im brace a nother opportunity of writing to you to inform you that we are all well at present. We hope that these lines may find you all in the Same . We received your letter with gladness to heaire that you ware all well. we have nothing much to write only that Abrahams wife has a nother boy a day or two old---as for the times they are hard, money is scarce and no worke to be had-- the price of wheate is from 7.¢ to 75¢ per bushel, peas are 39¢ to 40¢ and 44¢ per bushel, Potates are good and plenty and corn is a good crop all over--we had a good crop of peas and hay-- there are Some of our neighbors here that only got theair Seed again when they thrasht theair wheate-- the oates are lite they did not fill---

Now Mickel would like to know if John and Lenerd are goeing whare John Harder is to worke in the lumber boosh. Mickel is a goeing-- for we got a letter from John this weeke and he tels us that they offer 20 dollars per month and they Cant get hands for that-----We want you to write Soon. I was a calcalating to come out thare this fall--but Ssence Mickel is goeing i cant come till i come with boots and Briches we Remain yours.
