COPY OF A LETTER WRITTEN BY ADAM HARDER I , FROM CANADA.

Gra Kalora. Aldborough, October 19, 1862

Dear Son daughter and grand children. we im brace a nother opportunety of writing to you to inform you that we are all well at present. We hope that these lines may fine you all in the Same. We received your letter with gladness to heaire that you ware all well. We have nothing much to write only that Abrahams wife has a nother boy a day or two old---as for the times theay are hard, money is scarce and no worke to be had-- the price of wheate is from 7.4 to 75% per bushel, peais are 39% to hoand him per bushel, Potates are good and plenty and corn is a good crop all over--we had a good crop of heais and hay-- there are Some of our neaighbors here that only got theair Seed again when theay thrasht theair wheate-- the oates are lite theay did not fill---

Now Mickel would like to know if John and Lenerd are goeing whare John Harder is to worke in the lumber boosh. Mickel is a goeing -- for we got a letter from John this weeke and he tels us that theay offer 20 dollars per month and theay Cant get hands for that ----We want you to write Soon. I was a calcalating to come out there this fall -- but Ssence Mickel is goeing i cant come till i come with boots and Briches we Remain yours.
