

DEATH OF MRS. COLBY

BURIED THURSDAY AT GRAHAM
CHURCH

The funeral of Mrs. Eliza Colby will be held at her home this afternoon, (Thursday) at 2 o'clock, and she will be buried in the Graham cemetery.

She has had several paralytic strokes and these were the cause of her death, which occurred Tuesday at 2 o'clock in the morning.

She is seventy-seven years of age and leaves three sons—Earl, who resides at Ypsilanti, Sheridan, who practises law in Detroit, and William who lives on the farm. She leaves one daughter—Mrs. Henry Marsh. Her husband, William died fourteen years ago.

Eliza S Huntley was born in Ogden, N. Y. November 21, 1827. At the age of six years she moved with her parents to Hartland, Mich., where she lived until nineteen years of age, then with her parents, three brothers and four sisters she moved to the village of Howell, Livingston Co., Mich., where she spent a number of years in teaching school. Feb. 21, 1854 she was united in marriage to William Colby, of Woodhull, Shiawassee Co. Of this union five children were born, Floyd L., who died in 1883 aged 28 years; Viola E., now Mrs. H. Marsh of Laingsburg, W. L., living at the old home, Earl N. of Ypsilanti, and Sheridan J. of Detroit. For over fifty years she had lived on the farm, where she died of paralysis Sept. 8, 1904. She is survived by two sisters, Mrs. K. R. Smith of Berkeley, California and Mrs. B. F. Parsons of Brooklyn, N. Y.
